Mayor Novitke summarized the proposed budget for the benefit of those citizens attending the Council meeting, and recommended to the Council the adoption of the proposed budget as reviewed and amended by the Finance Committee. Mayor Novitke asked if anyone in the audience wished to be heard on the proposed Budget for 2005-06 Fiscal year as submitted.

No one in the audience wished to be heard. City Administrator Wollenweber gave a brief overview of the contents of the proposed budget, noting the millage rate was the same as the last fiscal year.

BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a public notice has been previously given, as required by City Charter and State of Michigan Public Act 5 of 1982, that the public hearing would be held at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, May 16th, 2005, for the purpose of receiving comments on the proposed 2005-06 City Budget and the intent to Increase Property Taxes within the said City of Grosse Pointe Woods, and;

WHEREAS, a full and final public hearing has been held on proposed 2005-06 City Budget, and the proposed Increase in Property Taxes, it is therefore the opinion and judgment of the Council that the aforesaid proposed 2005-06 City Budget is in all things appropriate, correct, and should be approved, and that the property Tax Levy should be increased accordingly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Grosse Pointe Woods, Michigan, that the proposed 2005-06 City Budget and the proposed property Tax Levy Increase for the fiscal year 2005-06 as finally reviewed (and/or changed by) the Council at this public hearing be adopted and the amounts as contained in the aforesaid budget should be appropriated as designated and property tax levied accordingly;

BE IT RESOLVED that there are those sums of revenue which are deemed necessary to be raised by <u>ad valorem</u> tax levies on all real and personal property within the City of Grosse Pointe Woods, and that the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to certify such amounts to the City Assessor for spreading on the 2005 City Tax Roll at the rate of 8.2828 mills per

thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable valuation for General Operating Purposes; at the rate of .9984 mills per thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable valuation for concrete replacement; at the rate of .5656 mills per thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable valuation for 1997 Park/Pool Debt Service; at the rate of .0616 per thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable valuation for Act 359 - Public Relations; at the rate of .3690 mills per thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable valuation for Emergency Medical Advanced Life Support Services; and at the rate of .8680 per thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable value for Act 345 - Police and Fire Retirement purposes; at the rate of 1.8443 mills per thousand of the current City of Grosse Pointe Woods taxable valuation for Solid Wastes/Recycling/Disposal Services.

APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION FOR THE 2005-06 GENERAL BUDGET AND THE VARIOUS OTHER FUND BUDGETS

The property tax millage rate of 11.1454 to be levied July 1, 2005 to support the proposed General Fund Budget will be the subject of this hearing. If adopted, the proposed millage will increase operating revenue from ad valorem property taxes by 4.23% or \$429,000 compared to the 2004-05 total tax collection of \$10,135,000.

And further, that the City Administrator and/or City Comptroller be authorized to make necessary changes between funds, activities, accounts, and reserves as required by law and authorized by adoption of the budget documents and this appropriation resolution and the approval of the Finance Committee. Any adjustments will not change the appropriated fund total for expenses as approved in this resolution and will be disclosed to the Council through budget reports.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that by approving the Appropriations Resolution, the Council authorizes the expenditures provided for in the Budget, in keeping with proper procurement procedures as outlined in the Charter and Purchasing Ordinances as adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all transfers from the Un-appropriated Funds Account be made upon further action of the Grosse Pointe Woods City Council. Extraordinary expenses not foreseen in this budget will be disclosed to the Council in keeping with the Charter and State laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the passage of this annual appropriation resolution is authorization for the expenditures cited hereby within the budget documentation herein.
