Director Kosanke,

Further to my message of March 3, 2017 to City Council requesting protocol around the use of property in front of and adjacent to City Hall, City Clerk Hathaway's March 6, 2017 correspondence with usage requirements, and the March 13, 2017 City Council meeting requesting further detail around this event, please find the following response points for date, time, purpose and a more granular event plan.

- The property usage dates are April 7 and April 8, 2017.
- Time of use would be no earlier than 8:00 AM and no later than 5:00 PM on each date.
- The purpose of the property usage is to solicit donations in support of the local Grosse Pointe
 Woods Knights of Columbus Annual Tootsie Roll Drive which funds local Grosse Pointe Woods
 special needs children's therapy and summer camp sessions. Further, a portion of the proceeds
 will support the State of Michigan Special Olympics regional and state competitions.
- The event plan involves six (6) adult only volunteers who will populate the circular drive adjacencies and the north side entrance of City Hall for soliciting donations for tootsie rolls in two hour shifts. There will be signs on Mack Avenue as well as either side of the circular drive (see attachment). All volunteers will be wearing bright yellow vests identifying the Knights of Columbus (see attachment).
- The normal permit application will be completed with lists of volunteers, their resident addresses, and birth dates. The will also be a proof of liability insurance document submitted to the City Clerk within the next 24 hours.

- In order to avoid congestion or a backup on Mack Avenue, solicitors will not be located near the entrance to the circular drive. Rather, there will be two following the bend in the driveway entrance, two twenty feet further, and one on the north side of the exit near but not in conflict with the bill and postal drop-off boxes. Each pair will be on the curb and on opposite sides of the driveway. There will be one additional volunteer near the north side entrance to City Hall. In all instances, care will be given to permit comfortable entrance and exit to visitors to City Hall.
- In as much as this is a first effort using this configuration, adjustments may be made intraday to
 ensure both safe exchanges with donors as well as unobstructed entrance and exit of visitors to
 the site.
- There may be instances whereby there are less than six volunteers per two hour shift and there
 may be a period of time when shifts are changing and there is some overlap. Volunteers will
 park in the north parking lot away from the first several rows, permitting more convenient
 spaces for visitors.
- All volunteers will be attired in tasteful yet casual clothing and all will be wearing vests and all will have same or similar containers to accept contributions.
- Please see attached "Rules" or "Code of Conduct" which all volunteers practice without exception.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if a personal meeting would be useful or if there are changes necessary to any of the above bullet pointes.

Knights of Columbus 2017 "Rules" and "Code of Conduct" (amended) Annual Tootsie Roll Drive to Benefit Special Needs Children

- Solicitors will be on the curb and not the street during green or red lights. Walking on the dotted white traffic lanes or solid turn lane guides is not permitted.
- The use of cones in or around the street is not permitted.
- Entry to the street from the curb will occur only at intersections when the "walk" sign is visible for purposes of entering or leaving an event session.
- Two lane traffic will have two solicitors, one on each side, where available and if not the lane absent of a volunteer will not be approached.
- Should eight solicitors not be present for the four intersections, there will be at least two at the two busiest intersections which have been determined by virtue of donations received and independently by informal automobile count conducted periodically in two hour intervals.
- Signage will be present in advance of all four (or more if permitted) intersections on each side of
 the intersection in the space between sidewalk and street or on the median (see attached
 photos). This will alert potential donors of whom we are and what we are supporting in order to
 facilitate the process of securing coins or dollar bills from wallets or purses as the donor vehicle
 approaches the intersection when it is deemed safe to do so without a distraction to the
 vehicles in proximity.
- Bright colored vests will also be worn by all solicitors which also identify them as K of C volunteers along with the cause being supported.
- Solicitors will not shout, nock on windows, or otherwise disturb, pressure, or distract drivers
 passing or stopping at intersections for red lights.
- There is additional granular detail around "Rules" which deal with an Officer on site who
 manages the volunteer identification, the actual permit, and the insurance certificates issued to
 the K of C State Council on behalf of its individual Councils, including the OLSOS Council #7780.
 This is normally the Council President, also known as the Grand Knight, who will pass on, to an
 Officer, documentation if absent of the intersection for any meaningful amount of time.

I recommend the event proceed as planned. I have attached the event guidelines and diagram.



COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE EXCERPT 01-30-17

Discussion ensued regarding the **trolley**. The Director of Public Services reviewed his memo dated January 5, 2017. The Mayor stated the trolley was purchased using \$42,756.00 from SMART Credits and donations; the City purchased the trolley for \$47,500.00. A mechanic evaluated the trolley prior to purchase and determined minor repairs were needed. The Director of Public Services is recommending selling the trolley due to the extensive and costly repairs anticipated in 2017 estimated at \$16,400.00 minimum. The Mayor asked the Director to find out what happened between the mechanic's original recommendation and now. The Director stated that we could obtain an appraisal and stated the broker's commission is 10% of the sale price. Once sold, the buyer pays to tow it. There was a consensus of the Committee to not repair the trolley. The Director was asked to inquire about the broker's contract, and to remove the trolley stop signs.

Additionally, the Mayor stated that because the trolley only ran half the number of times it was scheduled for last summer, half of the sponsorship monies should be refunded. There was a consensus of the Committee to refund half of the sponsorship monies.

Sale of City Trolley

Information on the condition of the city's 1991 Chance Coach Trolley was presented to the Committee of the Whole on Monday January 30, 2017. The trolley proved to be unreliable during 2016 with frequent breakdowns. As a result, the mayor and city council agreed that we should obtain information to proceed with the sale of the trolley.

Wayne P. Groome, dba Trolley Brokers, LLC, has been in the business of buying, selling and brokering used rubber-tire trolleys, tram sets and other unique people-transporting equipment since November of 1993. He has provided an appraisal on the GPW trolley from the information I provided to him. Without physically inspecting the trolley he feels it is worth \$20,000 to \$25,000, net to the City, and would be willing to market it for \$25,000.00. There is no charge for a listing on his website. As part of his service, he will bring a qualified buyer to the city, and once we accept an offer, he will finalize the sale and add his 10% commission to the sale price.

Wayne Groome is one of three people in the United States who is in the business of brokering used trolleys and trams on a daily basis. He has built his broker inventory to a high of 70 trolleys and 24 tram sets and is probably responsible for more used trolley equipment sales in the U.S. than any other company. Working the market day in and day out has given him an honest picture of what used trolleys are worth. Factors included in the appraisal equation include: year built, manufacturer, passenger capacity, wood interior, interior brass trim, type of flooring, exterior trim, air conditioning and heating, chassis, type of engine, mileage on coach, transmission type, open or enclosed body, undercarriage, body condition, miles on power plant, repair schedule and roof/glass condition.

I recommend we enter into an agreement with Trolley Brokers, LLC, 1631 Jacob Rd., Estes Park, CO 80517 to advertise and sell the city's 1991 Chance Coach at a 10% commission over the final sale price.
