Mr. Smith:

Medstar has appreciated the opportunity to serve the residents of the City of Grosse Pointe Woods for the past three years. Our integration into the city's public safety environment has been seamless, and the feedback received from residents has been overwhelmingly positive.

As you are aware, Medstar continuously seeks improvements and enhancements in the care and service that we provide to our patients and municipal stakeholders. As we examine our service to the Grosse Pointe communities, there is significant opportunity to increase service, reduce response times, and reduce clinical risk. As we propose to extend the ambulance service contract currently in place, we would like to offer the following enhancements to the service provided:

- Elimination of station-based crews, moving instead to deployment throughout the Grosse Pointe Communities from streetside posting locations. This change eliminates response time to the unit, as well mitigating the well-documented sleep cycle impact on waking crews to perform clinical procedures.
- Shared personnel and resources within the Grosse Pointe communities. This will
 provide more flexibility in deploying resources in the Pointes, and ability to shift
 resources between the cities as demand requires.
 - Medstar is one of the few emergency providers in the country to use a state of the art predictive demand computer system to provide 168-hour per week deployment models to insure the shortest response times to emergency requests. Our system also uses impedance monitoring and resource selection, which uses real-time traffic pattern and historical speed data to select the appropriate unit for response.
- Response time performance at or better than the previous three years.

With insurance reimbursement for EMS services stagnant over the past several years and everincreasing personnel and operating costs, the ability to maintain 24-hour station deployment in communities where there is not consistently increasing transport volume is very difficult. By sharing resources throughout communities, we are able to maintain or improve response times, reduce clinical risk, and address the revenue challenges that face our industry, all while continuing the compassionate, responsive care that Grosse Pointe Woods residents have come to expect from Medstar.

CHAPTER 6. - THE COUNCIL: PROCEDURE AND MISCELLANEOUS POWERS AND DUTIES

Section 6.1. - Regular Meetings.

The Council shall provide by resolution for the time and place of its regular meetings and shall hold at least two regular meetings each month. A regular meeting shall also be held on the Monday following each regular city election.
