The first item on the agenda was concerning **Building Official's Monthly Report.**Mr. Tutag reported the following:

- Peoples State Bank will be open the first week in September.
- The Building Department's two summer interns have gone back to school and hopefully will return next year.
- Some new businesses are opening and the vacancy rate will be updated soon.
- The Mack Avenue paving project has affected area businesses.
- SJH&MC is close to being complete. The parking lot is presently being landscaped.
- Residential construction is starting to pick up again.
- Construction is slowly continuing at Salvatorre Scallopini.

The next item on tonight's agenda was concerning **Council Report, August – Sucher:**

At the August 6th City Council meeting Bucci's request to upgrade a Tavern License to a Class C Liquor License was approved and the Mack Avenue paving project was discussed as a number of business owners were very dissatisfied.

At the August 6th ZBA meeting the minutes from the July 2nd ZBA meeting were approved, thus marking the start date for Sunrise's 30 day appeal clock.

At the August 20th City Council meeting the Mack Avenue paving project was once again discussed at length. There were some concerns by both residents and businesses over the lack of pedestrian crosswalks.

At the August 20^{th} ZBA meeting Woods Fine Wines' variance requests were approved.

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At this time, discussion ensued regarding 4' walls versus 6' walls between businesses and residential properties. It was commented that a 4' wall with the appropriate landscaping is adequate and would look better when the landscaping develops.

The next item on tonight's agenda was concerning **New Business** –

Discussion continued from tonight's Planning Commission Workshop regarding Sub-Committees:

Colonial Theme – Ready for adoption and awaiting exhibits/sketches to be included. A Planning Commission Workshop is scheduled for September 25th at 6:30 p.m. to finalize this sub-committee.

Crosswalks - Commission member Vitale provided a typical crosswalk sample. Assistant City Attorney C. Berschback will create a crosswalk resolution for next month's meeting to use as a guideline for future reference. Upon further discussion, it was agreed this sub-committee contact City Administrator Mark Wollenweber to discuss possible implementation of additional crosswalks on Mack Avenue.

Residential Study – Meeting scheduled on August 30, 2007.

Dumpster Evaluation – Meeting at City Hall on September 6, 2007 for a joint tour of neighboring cities.
